


What is the Basic Meeting List Toolbox?

- Software for maintaining the most up-to-date meeting information
- Written by addicts, for addicts
- In use by more than 875 service bodies and 26,000 (37%) meetings worldwide. ~80% of the meetings in the US are using it.
- Applications platform: websites, mobile apps, printable lists, phone lines.

Case Study: North Carolina Region

- 1. Our Services Structure in North Carolina, because of autonomy, follow spiritual boundaries.
- 2. Throughout the Service System in North Carolina, the delivery of services may not always cover the entire geopolitical boundaries.
- 3. Many of the Service Structure names in North Carolina make sense only to those familiar with our Service Structure.
- 4. External communications were sometimes fractured and it's not always obvious about which schedule or phone line to call to get help or information. (Either Addict-to-addict or Professional-to-PR).

Case Study: North Carolina Region

- 1. Uses a system called "Yap" that comes from the same approached that authored the BMLT.
- 2. A single statewide number went live in August 2018.
- 3. Routes to any location in North Carolina regardless of whether it's covered or not.
- 4. Encapsulates the Service System by creating a translation layer of geopolitical location to Service Body.

- 1. United States has a similar issue to North Carolina regarding service body coverage.
- 2. 407 Phone Lines in the United States as of Nov 2018.
- 3. Estimated costs for all the phonelines in the US total is \$250-300k / year.
- 4. No centralized database for phone numbers other than those listed on na.org and individual websites.
